## Intent:

PE at Castlemorton CE Primary School inspires all pupils to succeed through fun, high-quality physical activities. It is our intention to develop knowledge, skills and vocabulary in a broad range of sporting activities.

We provide opportunities for pupils to become physically confident in a way which supports their health and fitness. Our children will have opportunities to compete in sport and other activities that build character and help to embed values such as fairness and respect.

PE at Castlemorton is an important element of the curriculum. It promotes healthy life style choices, the need for a balanced diet, positive growth mind-set and the resilience to persevere with activities that may be out of a child's comfort zone. We are passionate about the need to teach children how to cooperate and collaborate with others. For them to learn to be part of a team and to embed life-long values such as, understanding fairness and equity of play. Children are given plenty of opportunities to build upon prior knowledge, allowing children to know more, and remember more.

Pupils are provided with opportunities to take part and excel in competitive sports and other physically-demanding activities. Provision is enhanced through the use of the Sports Premium Funding.

## **Implementation:**

There is planned overview of teaching and learning, divided into units that cover key physical education topics. This is reviewed, adapted and can flex with the needs of the children.

Rising Stars is the chosen platform used to implement much of the PE curriculum however other resource materials are used to provide a rich diet around the PE curriculum.

Sport has a high profile at Castlemorton and is woven and embedded into the daily life of the school. The grounds are used effectively to support physical development and there are a range of extra-curricular physical activities on offer.

There is a detailed scheme of work within Rising Stars and teachers use is as part of the planning process to create:

A cycle of lessons for each unit, which carefully plans for progression of skills and depth of understanding.

Castlemorton is part of a cluster of schools who collaborate together to provide high quality sporting opportunities. These range from festivals, tournaments and competitions and include a diverse and rich variety of sports/physical activities.

## Impact:

Our PE Curriculum is high quality, well thought out and is planned to demonstrate progression. If children are keeping up with the curriculum, they are deemed to be making good or better progress. In addition, we measure the impact of our curriculum through the following methods:

- A reflection on standards achieved against the planned outcomes
- Formative and summative assessments against expected outcomes
- A celebration of achievements
- Pupil discussions about their learning

Verbal feedback is provided within lessons with misconceptions addressed verbally. Formative assessments are made against expected outcomes and these assessments inform planning, support end of unit summative assessments and end of year reports.
