## NEWS 13 January 2024

#### Dear Friends

It's one of those times: whenever I hear the news - it's not good! Wars, earthquakes, lava flows, even our much-loved vicar retiring! I wonder if life might have been easier in less well-connected times, when people knew what was going on in their village but not much more. Then I reflect that there were other things to worry about then.

As a student I had two posters on my wall; one was Picasso's *Don Quixote* (a print, of course), and the other a picture of a rose with the words 'Life is not a bed of roses'. Picasso reminded me that there's no need to invent problems when they aren't there - don't tilt at windmills; the other reminded me that, as Job so eloquently put it, man is born to trouble as the sparks fly upwards (so are women).

So how do we respond to storms? For myself - often not too well. I like to be in control, and I can't control storms.

So it was for the disciples, crossing the Sea of Galilee. A 'furious storm' arose so that the 'waves swept over the boat'. Astonishingly, Jesus, though in the boat, was asleep. His disciples - certain of them seasoned sailors - cried out 'Lord, save us! We're going to drown!' (Matt 8:25). This was quite some storm. It unnerved the seasoned sailors.

So how to cope with storms, wherever we encounter them? Whether personal, or family, or a world in a whirl.

If I'm honest, I would tend to run around saying, with Corporal Jones, 'Don't panic!', while obviously panicking. Conversely, St Paul, in his letter to the Philippians, said 'have no anxiety about anything, but in everything, by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known unto God; and the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus'. And if any had a life of trouble and care it was him. Many would say, well, he's just being superspiritual. But I don't think so, and I think his counsel is worth aiming at. Which of us has changed anything by worrying? And which of us has lost anything by praying? The old army adage, that everyone prays in a foxhole, has truth in it. Might it be that God is training us to worry less and pray more?

I think we just need to make sure Jesus is in our boat. Can he be? Yes! The lovely passage in Revelation chapter 3 verse 20 reminds us: 'Behold, I stand at the door and knock, and if anyone opens to me I will come in and sup with him, and he with me'. Then, with Jesus close, we learn not to be fazed by happenings. Peter, when asked by Jesus whether he was going to stop following, said 'Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. We have come to believe and to know that you are the Holy One of God.' The choice in trouble is: faith, or fear?

Lord, in our trials *and* our joys, help us to walk with you, and show us always what we should do. Amen.


Refreshments are served after most services and children's activities are provided at St Gregory's during morning services. All are very welcome.
